The American Gold Buffalo 1 oz is a pure gold bullion coin authorized by the US Mint. Like the American Gold Eagle 1 oz bullion coin the American Gold Buffalo 1 oz is monetized with a face value of \$50.00. The US Mint began producing this popular 1 oz gold bullion coin in 2006 and the coin's date changes each year.

THERE ARE TWO TYPES IN PRODUCTION TODAY:

- 1 oz uncirculated bullion example traded for a small premium over its gold content.
- 1 oz specially minted proof made for the collector market.

Designs featured on the American Buffalo Gold Bullion Coins were taken from a previous US Mint strike that many consider to be one of the most beautiful ever produced by the US government – the circulating 1913-1938 “Buffalo Nickel” also known by some as the “Indian Head Nickel.” The coin’s designs were originally completed by James Earle Fraser.

Shown on the obverse of the Gold Buffalo is a portrait of a Native American Chief. Surrounding the portrait are the inscriptions of LIBERTY, the year of minting and an “F” for the artist Fraser. The reverse shows the image of a bison (also known as a buffalo). Surrounding the creature are the inscriptions of UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, E PLURIBUS UNUM, IN GOD WE TRUST, \$50 and 1 OZ. .9999 FINE GOLD.

1 OZ. GOLD AMERICAN BUFFALO 2006-CURRENT

The American Buffalo gold bullion coins are struck by the United States Mint's facility at West Point and have the distinction of being the first pure gold (.9999 fine, 24-karat gold) coins ever struck by the U.S. Mint for public sale as an investment product. Production of these coins was authorized by the Presidential \$1 Coin Act which provides for gold bullion to be minted in the form of \$50 legal tender coins, conveying that the content and purity is guaranteed by the United States Government.

According to the official U.S. Mint press release on June 20, 2006:

“This American Buffalo Gold Coin will appeal to both investors who choose to hold gold and to others who simply love gold,” said Deputy Director David A. Lebryk during the ceremonial striking at the United States Mint at West Point, where the coins are being produced. “These classic and beautiful American Indian and buffalo designs by James Earle Fraser [a student of Augustus Saint-Gaudens], which have been American favorites since they were first used in 1913, recall a golden age of coin artistry.”

Official mintages for the bullion strikes for the first few years of mintage are:

- 2006 – 337,012
- 2007 – 136,503
- 2008 – 189,500
- 2009 – 200,000
- 2010 – 209,000
